People love access to our facilities so Council should focus on things like public toilets in places where we want visitors to go. 2) Given we have experience and success at running two great events (and more smaller ones) the John O'Brien Festival and the Easter 'Street Car' Weekend has a history of drawing larger numbers of people to town - I suggest Council re-look at how 'we' as a town can boost the volunteers to work on these committees, as I feel many volunteers are ageing and suffer burn out from the exertion and constant work these Festival events require. Perhaps Council could bring in a temporary Consultant Project Manager to assist and support and grow our existing 'Festivals' and recruit younger people in town (with energy and enthusiasm)! 3) Histories and stories of the region are important. Our library and museum, educational institutions, Council records, the Argus etc has lots of historical information. I see an opportunity for a group/committee to really push to develop a 'Narrandera Collection of local identities, places, local and family histories' into a volume of work for publication and to place online for purchase. Council may be able to obtain funding for such a project and its a way of engaging the community and our local businesses etc. I would love our community to grow in strength and creativity to make Narrandera a better place to live, work and grow old. There! congrats if you get to the end.....well done!
