#### 1. Tiger Moth Memorial

Marie Bashir Park, Cadell Street (Newell Hwy)

This memorial houses a de Havilland DH82 Tiger Moth aeroplane as used by the RAAF No. 8 Elementary Flying Training School, which was located on the outskirts of Narrandera during World War II. The memorial includes collected memorabilia



from the training school and the pilots who trained there, including plane parts, photographs, uniforms and personal effects. A comprehensive collection of model aeroplanes is also included in the display. Treasure Hunt: Can you see where the pilot sits?

#### 2. Grandstand

**Marie Bashir Park, Adams Street** 

The land that would become Narrandera Park (now Marie Bashir Park) was set aside for public recreation in 1880, and the park itself was completed in 1899. The grandstand was built around 1910, and is still in use today. It is an example of a tiered Federation-style timber and



weatherboard grandstand, which were common at the time of construction, but which are now rarely seen.

#### 3. Narrandera Public School

**Adams Street** 

Narrandera Public School has been in continued operation as a school since the 1880s. The first classroom was built in 1883 of red brick in a Victorian style, with Georgian influences, and is still in use. Later additions include a Federation-style 1920s weatherboard building, and 1930's single storey red brick classroom buildings, which are significant as the work of Evan Smith, Government Architect, designed in the Inter-War Georgian Revival style.

# 4. Narrandera Hospital

**Cnr Adams Street and Douglas Street** 

Railway workers started fundraising in 1881 for the first cottage hospital, which was opened in 1883. A larger hospital building was constructed in 1885 and is still present onsite, it is constructed of red brick with bracketed eaves and two projecting faceted bays and a central entrance portico.

Over the years other buildings have been added to the site: an Infectious Block in 1902, nurses' quarters in 1906, and an extra ward in 1911. In the 1990's extensive work was done to 'modernise' the hospital.

The Victorian buildings in the hospital complex are of significance as they are some of the earliest in Narrandera. The additions and changes to the hospital reflect the growth of the town and the changing requirements of population and health to an institution that is historically of great importance to the community.

### 5. Residence

**53 Douglas Street** 

This red brick Federation residence was designed by John Hill Robinson for R. M. Wade-Ferrell, a Narrandera businessman who owned a number of shops in Twynam Street in the 1920s, which are

# 6. The Sturt Club

**45 Douglas Street** 

An attractive and well-detailed Federation cottage built by James Roach, a local sawmill operator and builder, in the 1890s. The cottage was purchased in 1906 for members of the Sturt Club, formed by the wives of Murrumbidgee Club members.

Treasure Hunt: Can you see the stripe that goes around the building?

# 7. 'MonRepos' / former Murrumbidgee Club

41-43 Douglas Street

A red brick, Queen Anne style residence built in the late 1890s by Edwin Roach, a member of one of Narrandera's pioneering farming families. The building showcases a number of significant architectural features,



including timber fretwork and elaborate chimneys

On 1 December 1903 a meeting of local gentlemen decided to form The Murrumbidgee Club. The foundation president was the Honourable (later Sir) Samuel McCaughey. The newly-formed club purchased the property from Edwin Roach for £1100 and the club house opened in June 1904. The club operated until the 1990s. The building is currently

# 8. St John's Uniting Church

**Cnr Douglas St and Cadell St (Newell Hwy)** 

This Federation Gothic Revival style church was built in 1907, and was originally a Presbyterian Church. Prominent land-owner Sir Samuel McCaughey was a major supporter, and donated three thousand guineas to the Presbyterian Church Centenary Fund, with the proviso that half be used toward the cost of building the new church in Narrandera. In total



the church cost £2672 to build. The octagonal spire was originally coated with copper sheeting, and is approximately 26 metres high from ground to

#### 9. Residence

**Cnr King Street and Cadell Street (Newell Hwy)** 

An Inter-War bungalow, designed by prominent Narrandera architect John Hill (J. H.) Robertson, as his own residence. J. H. Robertson designed many of Narrandera's iconic buildings.

# 10. Lodge Leopold / former Masonic Lodge

31 Cadell St

Lodge Leopold was founded in Narrandera in October 1884, making it one of the oldest social institutions in Narrandera. The Lodge building itself was designed by architect J.H was constructed in 1909. portico at the front entrance, and a

Robertson, in an Edwardian style, and The building features a classical revival square widow's walk on the roof.

The building is no longer a Masonic Lodge, and now serves as Narrandera's Art and Community Centre.

# 11. Former Baptist Church

32 Bolton Street

Built in 1891 as a Wesleyan Church, in a Gothic Revival style simplified to reflect Wesleyan doctrine, it later became a Baptist Church. Although no longer operating as a church, the building remains the second oldest surviving church building in Narrandera.

Treasure Hunt: Can you see the white arcs over the windows?

#### 12. Former Plaza Theatre

31-35 Bolton Street

Built in 1934 by Nick Laurantus, who built many picture theatres in the region, the Plaza Theatre was an important part of social life in Narrandera for many years, particularly before the advent of television. The building is currently owned by the Christian Revival Crusade (CRC), and used for a variety of religious and social events. Many of the building's original features remain, with restorations being undertaken by the CRC to return the building to its former glory.

Treasure Hunt: What features can you see that reveal the building's past as a theatre?

#### 13. The New Criterion Hotel

100-106 East Street

Designed by local architect J. H. Robertson in 1938. Some references in design to Inter-War Bungalow style, with Art Deco motits around the East Street entry. The New Criterion operated as a hotel and public bar before being converted to a motel-style Bed & Breakfast and function centre in the 2010s. The New Criterion was named after the Criterion Hotel which originally stood on the same site.

## 14. Richards Store (currently Coles supermarket)

This prominent main street building is a notable example of a large country town emporium/department store with many original features, including the upper parapet divided into bays with curved tops, and pebble dash render. The upper storey windows are alternating pairs of rectangular and arched heads, one storey high, with coloured glass panes. The building was originally owned by Solomon Richards, an early Narrandera businessman, who established a drapers and general store in Narrandera in 1889.

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15. Kiesling Lane Heritage Walk



The story of Narrandera's development is told on a series of storyboards and images on the walls of Kiesling Lane (beside the pharmacy in the centre of East Street). Wander along this pedestrian laneway to discover photos and stories from Narrandera's past.

# 16. Former Union Bank Building

126-128 East Street

This Federation-style building with Art Nouveau details was built in the early 1900s to house the Union Bank. It later housed the ANZ bank until 2014, then became a private residence with offices. The symmetrical façade with its arched entryway and balcony above make



the building stand out as unique in Narrandera's main street.

#### 17. Royal Mail Hotel

**137 East Street** 

This late Victorian style hotel was built in 1888 by a former Cobb & Co mail coach driver, Thomas Gough. At the time the hotel was considered 'the leading commercial hostelry' in Narrandera, with thirty rooms and plentiful stabling available. One of the first commercial buildings in East Street, for many years the Royal Mail Hotel was used as a venue for many important civic events, including the civic reception for the Minister of Works in July 1900, when he laid the foundation stone for the Post Office on the opposite corner.

The first postal facilities in the Narrandera district were established at Gillenbah in 1859, then later moved across the river to what is now 126 Larmer Street. #### 19. Former AMP Society Building

13-15 Twynam Street

Built in 1922 for the Australian Mutual Provident Society, the Spanish Mission Classical Revival style of this building makes it stand out. It is the only building in Narrandera built in this style, and displays many significant features, including the hipped roof of



in this building is solid cedar, some of which is hand-carved. The building is now a private residence.

# 20. Mechanics' Institute

17 Twynam Street

In 1886 a public meeting was held, and the decision made to form the Narrandera Mechanics' Institute, to provide local workmen with access to a library of books and journals, educational talks, and recreational

space. The Institute was originally granted rooms within the Council Chambers, but in 1909 moved into this purpose-built Federation-style building, designed by local Narrandera architect Ernest Laver. The building continued to house Narrandera's public library until 1999, and is now used as a training centre.

# 21. Narrandera Fire Station

**BOLTON ST**

23 Twynam Street Narrandera Fire Station has stood upon this spot since 1902. The

original weatherboard building was officially deemed inadequate in 1925, and shortly thereafter burned down. The current late Federationstyle red brick building was designed by builders Haynes and

Dixon, and constructed in 1927. It still operates as the Narrandera Fire Station to this day. Treasure Hunt: Can you see the semi-circular windows?




Located in a building over a century old, the Parkside Cottage Museum was established in 1968, and houses a varied collection of items from Narrandera's past, as well as many items donated from private collections. Of particular note are: the Macarthur Cloak, made from wool from the 1816 shearing of the

Macarthur family's merinos, and once owned by noted Narrandera resident Dr Harold Lethbridge; an extensive collection of Wiradjuri artefacts from the local region; the navigation maps of Captain T Bynon, one of the early Murrumbidgee riverboat captains; relics from the large Chinese settlement that thrived along the Murrumbidgee river at Narrandera in the 1800s; and

22-26 Twynam Street



St Faith's was built in 1936 as a private hospital, and officially opened on Tuesday 18 May 1937. In total, the building and equipment cost £20,000 at time of opening, much of which was donated by private benefactors, and it was reported to be one of the finest private hospitals in the state. Since being decommissioned as a hospital the building has been used to provide student accommodation, as government offices, and as private offices.

# 25. National Australia Bank/former CBC Bank

142 East Street

Originally constructed in 1884 for the Commercial Banking Company of Sydney Ltd (CBC), this fine Victorian style building was designed by the Mansfield brothers, whose distinctive architectural signature can be seen in many Victorian era CBC buildings throughout the state. Currently housing the National Bank of Australia, this building is notable for having operated as a bank for over 100 years.

Treasure Hunt: What is the decorative pattern in the cast iron balustrades on the verandah?

#### 26. Memorial Gardens & Hankinson Fountain

**Victoria Square** 

Narrandera's Memorial Gardens include monuments to those who served in the First and Second World Wars, as well as the Boer, Korean, Malaysian and Vietnam Wars.



In the centre of the Gardens stands the Hankinson Fountain, donated in 1922 by Alderman R.H. Hankinson and his wife, 'in honour of all those in Narrandera and District who served in the Great War 1914-1918'. Made of Royal Doulton ceramic, the fountain is unique; the only other Royal Doulton ceramic fountain known to exist is located in Pakistan.

#### 27. 'Normanville

98-100 Victoria Avenue

'Normanville' is an original Victorian residence, built in the 1880s, and is one of the few houses from this era remaining in Narrandera. The location


reflects the town development in

the 1880s, which centred between Larmer Street, for the river trade, and the Wagga Road (now Victoria Avenue), the Cobb and Co. coach route. Treasure Hunt: Can you see the name of building? Where is it?

# 28 Narrandera Shire Council Chambers

**141 East Street** 

The first meeting of the Narrandera Borough Council was held in the Court House in Larmer Street on 11 June 1885. The foundation stone for the current Council Chambers was laid on 26 October 1929, and the completed building was officially opened on 16 April 1930. The building was designed by John Hill Robertson, and is a great example of mannered Inter-War Classicism. The clock tower gracing the building was donated as a gift to the ratepayers by thenmayor Alderman R.H. Hankinson and his wife.

#### 29 Jonsen's Building

149-157 East Street

This Victorian-style terrace of five two-storey shops was built in 1893 by Mr A. N. Jonsen, and is the only example of its kind in the town. Mr Jonsen was one of Narrandera's first store keepers, and probably the town's first real estate developer; he bought a considerable amount of land in the developing town, which he later sold in smaller parcels to homeowners, shopkeepers, and the local Council.

#### 30. Murrumbidgee Hotel

**159 East Street** 

Built in 1910, this large Federation-style hotel has cast iron, fluted Doric columns supporting its wide double-storied verandah. The hotel still operates as a hotel and public bar, with dining facilities and function room. Treasure Hunt: Can you see the fluted columns? How many are there?

# 31. St Joseph's School

**Audley Street (main entrance via Larmer St)** 

St Joseph's Primary School has operated on this site since 1899, when the original classrooms were constructed in Federation Gothic Revival style. Additional buildings were added in 1923 in an inter- War Gothic style. More modern school buildings have been added to the site in the decades since.

#### 32. St Mel's Catholic Church

**Audley Street** 

St Mel's Catholic Church is a fine example of a well ornamented Gothic Revival Church, with continuity of religious worship since 1910. A memorial to bush poet John O'Brien (aka Fr Patrick Hartigan, parish priest from 1917



to 1944) is located in the church yard. A convent was constructed next door, in a similar Gothic Revival style, for the nuns of St Joseph's, and is now part

#### 33. John O'Brien Heritage House / Catholic Presbytery **60 Audley Street**

The Catholic Presbytery was built in the late 1880s and has been home to many priests of the Parish of St Mel's, including Fr Patrick Hartigan, better known as the bush poet John O'Brien. Father Hartigan was parish priest of St Mel's from 1917 to 1944, during which time he wrote numerous poems inspired by the local community, and his own life living in regional Australia, as the son of an Irish Catholic family and as a 'Bush PP' (Parish Priest). Many of his poems were published under the name 'John O'Brien', and were later collected into two volumes: 'Around the Boree Log' and 'The Parish

# 34. Dangar's Folly / The Gunya Scout Hall

9 Sturt Street

Unique from all other buildings in Narrandera, and tucked away from main thoroughfares, Dangar's Folly is a quirky architectural hidden treasure. Constructed of roughly-dressed quartzite stone in 1924, the building was designed by architect J.H. Robertson for ambitious local landowner O.H. Dangar. Originally intended as part of a larger housing development, the castellated building was designed for use as a stable and garage, with a groom's room and fodder room located in the upper level. Mr Dangar's housing development plans were thwarted by the economic depression of the late 1920's, leaving only the stables completed. The building was later granted to the Narrandera Scouts Group in perpetuity.

## 35. 'Bungoona'/former Australian Joint Stock Bank 160-162 East Street



'Bungoona' was designed by Benjamin Backhouse, in a simplified Academic-Classical style. It was constructed in 1884 for the Australian Joint Stock Bank, the first bank to be established in Narrandera. Construction of the building was completed shortly before that of the CBC Bank on the opposite corner.

# 36. Ensign Building

**164 East Street** 

This Victorian Classic Revival-style building was built in 1886 for the local newspaper the 'Narrandera Ensign', a rival to the 'Narrandera Argus' on the opposite side of the street. The 'Narrandera Ensign' remained in publication

## 37. '9o-Merry'/'Antique Corner'

**126 Larmer Street** 

This carefully-restored, two-storey, late-Victorian style building was one of the earliest stores in Narrandera. Constructed in the early 1870s, it stands on the site of Narrandera's first post office, which was destroyed by flood. The building is currently a private

#### 38. Old Post Office / Police Inspector's Residence

125 Larmer Street

residence and antique store.

Built in 1882 as a Post and Telegraph Office, this red-brick building was purchased by the Police department in 1900 to become Narrandera's first brick-and-mortar police station. The building was later converted to become the official Police Inspector's Residence and office.

#### 39. Former Royal Hotel

34 Larmer Street

Built in 1862, the Royal Hotel was one of the earliest buildings constructed in Narrandera, and one of the town's earliest hotels. In the absence of public and community buildings, many events important to the town's early history occurred in the building. At different times the hotel served as post office, court, church, and council premises. The hotel was delicenced in 1938, to public outcry from locals who didn't wish to see the beloved old hotel go. Treasure Hunt: How many doors are there along the front of the building?

#### 40. Narrandera Court House

**Cnr Larmer Street and Cadell Street (Newell Hwy)** 

Narrandera Court House was built in 1900 and has been in use as a court house ever since. The design of the court house is an example of Federation Freestyle, and is the work of two prominent Government Architects, Barnet and Vernon, who were influential in the design of many public buildings

Treasure Hunt: Can you see the coat of arms?

#### 41. Narrandera Police Station / former Lock-Up Keeper's Residence

129-131 Larmer Street

This elegant Queen Anne style building was designed by Government architect James Barnet in 1879, and was one of the earliest brick buildings in Larmer Street. In the 1930s the building was the local lock-up and lock-up keeper's residence. It became the official Police Station in the 1980s, after work was done to extend the building and improve facilities on the site.

Treasure Hunt: How many pillars are there?

### 42. Old Police Cells

129-133 Larmer Street

The earliest police lock-up in Narrandera was a tent containing a butcher's block with a bolt and ring driven through it, to which offenders would be chained. When the group of Police buildings were built, at the end of the 19th Century, red brick cells were constructed in the yard behind the police buildings. These cells still stand, and are currently used as storage space.

### 43. Former Police Barracks

133 Larmer Street

Constructed as police barracks in the late 19th Century, this Victorian Georgian style house has a long history serving law and order in Narrandera. As with all of the Police Department-owned buildings in Larmer Street, it served for a time as the local police station, as well as being a barracks and sergeant's quarters.

Treasure Hunt: Can you see the paired windows?

### 44. St Thomas' Anglican Church

**Cnr Larmer Street and Adams Street** 

The oldest church in Narrandera, St Thomas' is built in a simplified Gothic Revival style, with buttressed walls constructed from local brick. The foundation stone for the church was laid in November 1879, and the first service in the completed church was held on 28 September 1880. The square bell tower was a later



addition in 1891. A second Anglican church was constructed by Narrandera's then-flourishing Chinese community in 1894, but is no longer standing.

Variously referred to as the 'Hit and Miss' and the 'Hit or Miss', and constructed in 1860, this was one of Narrandera's three earliest hotels. Prior to the construction of churches and a courthouse in Narrandera, the Hit and Miss served as a location for church services and court hearings,



as well as other civic occasions. A murder inquest was once conducted here by magistrate Thomas Alexander Brown who lived on a property nearby, and who later wrote 'Robbery Under Arms' and other works under the name Rolf Boldrewood. The building is currently a private residence.

# 46. Residence

**129 Audley Street** 

This Victorian-style residence features a large Federation-style portico which was added to the front entrance some years after original construction. The building displays a fine example of rare dichromatic brickwork above the window arches.



### Whitton Street and Narrandera's Railway Precinct

The construction of Narrandera's Railway Precinct, during the railway boom of the 1880s, had a significant impact on the physical layout of the town, as well as on Narrandera's financial prosperity. The opening of the Narrandera-Hay rail-line contributed to the decline of the Murrumbidgee riverboat trade, and shifted markets for Riverina produce from Melbourne to Sydney.

## 48. Railway Station & Station Master's Residence

Whitton Street (Newell Hwy)

The railway and station at Narrandera were officially opened on 28 February 1881, and had a major impact on the physical form and growth of the town, causing the town centre to shift north from its original orientation along Larmer Street and the river front. The station building was designed by John Whitton and constructed

by Wagga Wagga builder Charles Hardy, with later additions in 1912 and 1917. Narrandera Railway Station is a notable example of a Victorian-style railway station, and is aesthetically significant with its painted brickwork, articulated quoins, corbelled eaves, gabled wings and elaborately decorated platform awning.

The Station Master's residence was built in 1884 and is a good example of a Victorian two-storey residence. The two-storey brick residence has aesthetic significance with its symmetrical façade and hipped roofline with tall chimneys, the double-storey verandah and cast iron lacework balustrade.

The Star Hotel is a two storey red brick building with substantial double storey verandah, with cast iron columns, balustrades and frieze panels on two sides of the hotel. The building was designed by Narrandera architect J. H. Robertson, and was completed in 1916. It exemplifies the large wellbuilt railway hotels of the early 1900s.

# 50. Hall's Hotel

**Cnr East Street and Whitton Street (Newell Hwy)** 



Hall's Hotel was constructed in c1890, following the opening of the railway line. It was originally constructed as a single storey building and was known as the New Junction Hotel. Later additions converted the building to its current two storey design. The building is of Georgian style, and currently operates as a café and second-hand bookstore.
